## Pastor's Corner -

### **First Sunday of Advent**

A frail old man went to live with his son, daughter-in-law, and four-year old grandson. The old man's hands trembled, his eyesight was blurred, and his step faltered. The family ate together at the table. However, the elderly grandfather's shaky hands and failing sight made eating difficult. Peas rolled off his spoon onto the floor. When he grasped the glass, milk spilled on the tablecloth. The son and daughter-in-law became irritated with the mess.

"We must do something about Grandfather," said the son. "I've had enough of his spilled milk, noisy eating, and food on the floor." Therefore, the husband and wife set a small table in the corner. There, Grandfather ate alone while the rest of the family enjoyed dinner. Since Grandfather had broken a dish or two, his food was served in a wooden bowl. When the family glanced in Grandfather's direction, sometimes he had a tear in his eye as he sat alone. Still, the only words the couple had for him were sharp admonitions when he dropped a fork or spilled food. The four-year-old watched it all in silence.

One evening before supper, the father noticed his son playing with wood scraps on the floor. He asked the child sweetly, "What are you making?" Just as sweetly, the boy responded, "Oh, I am making a little bowl for you and Mama to eat your food in, when I grow up." The four-year-old smiled and went back to work. The parents were speechless. Then tears started to stream down their cheeks. Though no word was spoken, both knew what must be done.

That evening, the husband took Grandfather's hand and gently led him back to the family table. For the remainder of his days, he ate every meal with the family. Moreover, for some reason, neither husband nor wife seemed to care any longer when a fork was dropped, milk spilled, or the tablecloth became soiled.

Children are remarkably perceptive. Their eyes observe, ears listen, and minds process the messages they absorb. If they see us patiently provide a happy home atmosphere for family members, they will imitate that attitude for the rest of their lives. The wise parent realizes that every day the building blocks are being laid for the child's future. Therefore, let's be wise builders and role models! (next column...)

## Pastor's Corner continued...

*I met a man, who was just frail, sad looking and with a shivering voice. He told me that he has been preparing for his death in a few days. Doctor had told him that he would not survive the present week. He was in our Church campus. I spent a lot of time being silently sitting with him. I could not get words, gestures to console him. He told me, "Father, it is difficult to accept death so near. But coming to Church campus and spending time here has been really consoling. I have seen so many people's funeral here, I was present for their funeral mass celebration, and now it is my turn. Father, I am sure God will forgive me all my mistakes and sins". I told him, "Yes, Our Father is Loving Father. He has already forgiven you." The man got up, and slowly shook my hand, and asked for my blessing. He was just leaving the Church campus and a tear rolled down my eyes. The man died in two days, and I conducted his funeral. I saw in this man a great preparation to meet the Lord of Heaven and Earth. His advent began in our Church campus, and ended there. Blessed this man, I will not forget him easily.*

*Advent is marked by a spirit of expectation, of anticipation, of preparation, of longing. There is a yearning for deliverance from the evils of the world, first expressed by Israelite slaves in Egypt as they cried out from their bitter oppression. It is the cry of those who have experienced the tyranny of injustice in a world under the curse of sin, and yet who have hope of deliverance by a God who has heard the cries of oppressed slaves and brought deliverance!*
