## **Nativity Scene.**

There is good progress with respect to expanding the outside Nativity Scene for the roof of the rectory entrance. Thanks to a donation from Hal McInerney, we now have 3 brand new kings as well as a donkey to add to our scene, while Noel Dimalanta has purchased a 2<sup>nd</sup> flood light.

The intention is to install the plywood base on Saturday Dec. 5<sup>th</sup> at 10:00AM. So far Duncan, Philippe and Noel have volunteered to help. On Saturday Dec. 12<sup>th</sup> at 10:00AM we will be installing all the figurines and Christmas trees and install all the lights. Again volunteers to assist with the installation are welcome. There will be a motion during our meeting whether or not to install a sign "Keep Christ in Christmas" together with our council's name near this nativity scene.

## **Knights of Columbus Annual Charity Appeal 2009**

As a new council we are apparently not yet on the list of participating councils, but we received a call from our State Deputy, Michael Yeo, if our council could start with 30 books for 10 tickets each. That is less the one book per member. Charity Appeal is fully endorsed by the provincial government and is for most BC councils their major fundraiser. Almost half of the amount raised (tickets sold) will be returned to our council to help charity institutions with their work. The prizes are fabulous; 5 cars, 2 scooters and many cash prizes. More information will be available at our general meeting.

## **Columbus Charity Association**

This Knights of Columbus Association, dealing with the many K of C Senior Citizens Residences in Vancouver and the lower mainland (including our Millennium Tower), requires 2 members of each council on the Board of Directors. Bro. John MacDonald volunteered already and a second member of our council is required. Meetings are twice a year only.

## **Fund Raisers**

Catholic Mission Canada will make available 25 beautiful calendars for 2010 free of charge to our council, except for mailing costs of \$10. In turn our council can then distribute these to our members and/or parishioners for a donation and thus raise more funds.

## **Bingo**

The staff at our Knights of Columbus Millennium Tower have scheduled a bingo for the residents on Wednesday Dec. 9<sup>th</sup> 2009 from 1:00PM to 2:30PM and have asked our council members to assist in this activity. In the summer our council already assisted the Millennium Tower staff with their BBQ which was most appreciated by the residents. So brother Knights, please consider donating some time for this charitable work on Dec. 9<sup>th</sup>. ### **Stamp Collecting**

Please save your used stamps and bring them to the meeting or drop them off in the special stamp box at the church entry foyer. Many stamps have so far already been collected and some members have volunteered to cut away most of the paper surrounding the stamps as required by the dealers buying the stamps. Also over \$30. worth of uncanceled stamps have been collected saving our council postage while mailing letters. Especially foreign stamps are in high demand. The proceeds are for the State Vocation Program, assisting seminarians with their fees.
